Here's one you may not know. The inner courtyard of Rio Grande High School (this picture does not do it justice) is shaded by truly enormous cottonwoods. The marching band practices here and their sound bounces off the walls. Students hold lunchtime dances here, rolling out a portable sound system and speakers. All fall, leaves drift down on the Ravens.

So why trees? Because trees are made of human breath. In the month of March, we'll be celebrating breathing, something we don't take for granted since Covid 19. We breathe in. We breathe out. We feed the trees and they feed us. 
