PROGRAM

Barbara, NMSO 1st VP, has been busy over the last couple of months sending to chapter presidents the EEC newsletter that our DKG International organization creates. She hopes that chapters have been able to use this newsletter while finding new ways to conduct meetings, recruit new members, etc.

In January, she and former Immediate Past State President Pat Graff traveled to Alamogordo to meet with Kappa Chapter's President Judy Pingel and her Kappa members, who are helping to organize this Spring's State Convention. They had a lovely visit sharing ideas and seeing where the meetings would be held.

In March, she and Pat Graff will attend the DKG US Forum National Legislative Seminar that will be held in Washington DC from the 9th through the 13th. MEMBERSHIP



It is not too late to think about earning the rose gold key for this year's membership retention challenge. I am including the requirements for the key again for your information. Please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions about the details.

- 1. Retain 100% of your membership
 - Exceptions to that are:
- a. relocation of member
- b. death of member

(It is your number at the beginning of April that will determine the fulfillment of this requirement. If you lose a member, you must gain a member to balance out the loss)

2. Use multiple medium for meeting presentation

Use at least two of the following:

- a. Regular face to face meeting with program
- b. Zoom meeting or hybrid zoom/face to face
- c. Outdoor activity/meeting
- d. Service type meeting

Some possible activities are but are certainly not limited to:

- i. Christmas caroling at nursing home
- ii. Activity at a children's home (Assurance Home)
- iii. Stuffing backpacks for Back-to-School event
- 3. Assign a mentor member to each new member (last year inductee or newer). This mentor is responsible for checking in with the member on a regular basis and encourage them to attend chapter meetings and activities.
- 4. At least one member attend Fall meeting and/or State Convention who has never attended these meetings before.

As part of the membership/retention challenge, using different medium of presentation is a requirement. Any of the above mentioned activities would count for this. Also, don't forget that zoom presentations are a viable way to allow your members to attend meetings when they otherwise would not be able to. See, there are some good things that came from the Pandemic!!!

I look forward to seeing many chapters completing this retention challenge.



Begin to prepare award nominations according to NMSO Standing Rules: **ARTICLE XI. ACTIVITIES**, Section 3. Special Awards

2. Certificate of Merit

- (1) The chapter presidents and state president are responsible for submitting names to recognize individuals and/or groups of members for distinctive service to the NMSO.
- (2) There is no restriction on length of membership in the Society and no restriction on the number of recipients.
- (3) Individuals and groups are to be nominated on forms provided by the Awards Committee chairman.

3. Longevity Awards

- (1) Awards shall be given at State Convention.
- (2) Awards shall be given at 40 years of membership and subsequently for every 5 years membership.

State Standing Rules – The deadline for these awards and the NMSO Achievement Award is March 15.

Educator Recognition Award deadline for nominations is April 1st. Send nominations and photos to Diana Valdez. Forms are on the website for nominations and chapter announcement to awardees. Chapters are responsible for awardees' lunches, travel and lodging. No refunds will be distributed this year.
