### **Pat Graff**



Pat Graff is a National Board Certified Teacher and a member of DKG for 22 years. She graduated from Oklahoma State University's College of Ed. which recently named her to their Alumni

Hall of Fame. She taught in APS for 38 years, starting at Cleveland Middle School and then moving to La Cueva High School when it opened in 1986.

During her teaching career, Ms. Graff received over one hundred awards, grants, and recognitions. She was New Mexico's Teacher of the Year in 1993 and one of four finalists for the national honor. Pat received the Milken Educator Award in 1994, was named the National High School Journalism Teacher of the Year in 1996 and was Disney's English Teacher of the Year in 1998. In 2006, she was named the first New Mexican to be inducted into the National Teachers Hall of Fame.

She is currently Theta State's first vice-president and served two biennia as Gamma's chapter president. As Theta State's 2<sup>nd</sup> vice-president, she chaired the state's membership initiative. Recently she was appointed the SW Region's representative to the DKG International Education Excellence Committee. Pat now works with teachers in northern New Mexico who are working on National Board certification. Pat and her husband Mark live in ABQ. She has two sons and has seven grandchildren with whom she travels frequently. Pat's daughter-in-law, Fateesha Graff, is a nursing educator and also a member of Gamma chapter.

### Joe Anne Clarkson



Joe Clarkson taught 7<sup>th</sup> grade ELA in Hobbs Schools for 25 years and has been the assistant principal at Murray Elementary for 4 ½ years. She joined Delta Kappa Gamma in 2008 and has served as treasurer, vice president, and president of her

- Theta State Scholarship(s) available to be awarded: up to \$2,000
- \*Not all scholarships will be awarded each year; decisions to award or not will be made based on availability of funding and/or the number of qualified applicants
  - Eligibility:
    - Applicants must be members of a Theta State Chapter for at least 3 calendar years.
    - Service to Delta Kappa Gamma is an important criterion in the selection of a recipient.
    - Applications should be electronically submitted on/before the deadline (March  $15^{st}$  of the year awarded) **Incomplete or late applications will not be eligible for consideration.**
- Theta State Scholarship Application Packet Requirements
  - Electronically submit one complete application packet (items a-e below) to Kelly Raye Williams, Scholarship Chairman at **kraye22@comcast.net** 
    - the completed application form;
    - an original photograph (applicant only) suitable for publication;
    - a brief written account (use template provided) of your proposed program plans with documentation of current enrollment (This account should include institution, major, degree, beginning date, anticipated completion date, a brief description of courses completed, and the professional goals to be accomplished through this program. Current enrollment can be documented through a screenshot or a copy of the applicant's graduate school registration page showing name and present course enrollment);
    - an accounting of your service to Delta Kappa Gamma, as detailed on the application. (This should include offices and committee appointments at the chapter, state, and international levels; attendance at Delta Kappa Gamma conferences and conventions; participation in training sessions and legislative and/or leadership seminars; and other services rendered to Delta Kappa Gamma. Please include dates of service or participation.); and
    - The name, phone and e-mail contact information of 3 references defined below. You may include signed letters of reference with your application packet. (Signed letters are not required.)
      - the current **president** of your chapter (or another officer if you are the president),
      - a direct supervisor/administrator of your **professional** work, and

### **Keeping the Education Excellence Focus in Local Chapters Virtually**

Here are a few more ideas for members and chapters to try during these continuing quarantine times, based on our Education Excellence Committee guidelines:

- **Charades:** During a meeting, send a private message to one member of a movie title or book title or song title and have that individual act out the title while the rest of the chapter guesses. For extra fun, have a few prizes that can be mailed after the meeting!
- **Five Second Rule:** Each attendee has five seconds to name at least three things in a specific category. Example categories might be ice cream, vacation spots, favorite NM things, clothing, Italian food, soft drinks, DKG activities.
- **Match Game Photo Style:** Before your meeting ask each attendee to send you a photo (it can be scanned or taken with a cell phone) of her as a baby or toddler. Then, create a slide show and share it with members, asking them to guess which photo belongs to which member.
