CCC MEMBERS VISIT CASA SAN YSIDRO

On Saturday, February 8, 2020, members of the CCC (Central Coordinating Council) from Alpha Iota, Alpha Delta, and Gamma Chapters enjoyed a wonderful sunny day at the Casa San Ysidro ((the Gutierrez-Minge House) in Corrales, NM. The Casa San Ysidro is managed by the Albuquerque Museum. In the early 1950s, Shirley and Ward Alan Minge took a late 19th century building and turned it into a plazuela-style rancho to house their exuberant collection of New Mexico vernacular art. They lived there for many years and then donated the property to the City of Albuquerque in the late 1990s.

A docent conducted the tour explaining how the Minges renovated and refurbished the historical property. Casa San Ysidro embodies the collective creativity of generations of artists and craftspeople in its furnishings and architectural features, exemplifying an interesting tension between tradition and change that New Mexicans have lived with for centuries.

Prior to the tour CCC members had a wonderful lunch at Flying Star in Corrales.

Carmen was a vibrant and dedicated woman in every aspect of

her life: as a wife and mother, grandmother and greatgrandmother, educator, community leader and a DKG member.

Carmen taught Family and Consumer Science at Bernalillo Middle School. With great creativity and energy, she created a city within the school called **Econopolis** where students learned financial skills, public service, and cooperation.



She served Theta State in numerous areas beginning in 1999 when she served as Professional Affairs Chairman—a position she served in for two biennia. Carmen went on to be elected TS Second Vice-president/Membership

Chairman 2005-2007; First Vice-

president/Program Chairman 2007-2009.

She served on the Bylaws Committee 2007-2013, conducted a workshop at the International Convention in Chicago 2008, and was the coordinator 2008-2010 with CNM in the Teacher Mentorship Program. In 2009, Carmen was awarded the highest honor of Theta State-The Theta State Achievement Award.

Carmen served Alpha Delta Chapter in many ways including Chapter President 2012-2014. She became a Nationally Certified Parliamentarian in 2016 and served as State Parliamentarian in 2017-2019. She also took on the responsibility of coordinator for TS Conventions in Albuquerque and for Fall Executive Board Meetings/Birthday Luncheon. She graciously welcomed DKG members from around the state into her home with warm hospitality on the many occasions when state officer meetings were a necessity.

Carmen was a champion for fairness and equality in every aspect of her life. Her love of life, her determination, her laughter, and her very special personality will be deeply missed.

Her memorial was held Friday, February 14, 2020, at Holy Ghost Catholic Church, where we were all reminded of her love for Elvis Presley.
