
EDITOR'S MESSAGE



COMMITTEE NEWS

PROGRAM FOR CHAPTERS NEED NOT SUFFER DURING COVID-19 QUARANTINE

All our members are missing their chapter meetings and their DKG sisters because of the stay-at-home orders and quarantine issues related to the Covid 19 virus,, there are still opportunities to "program" for ourselves and our members. Here are a few ideas, based on our Education Excellence Committees.-

PROGRAM: Set up a Zoom chapter meeting (or use another tech platform) that allows members to talk and chat. Send out emails a week before the meeting so members can download the platform and plan the time. This can be a business meeting, a chat among members, or a combination of both. In Gamma chapter, one of my creative members sent everyone a variety of recipes for "Mug Cakes" and ladies were encouraged to make their "refreshments" before the meeting, then we shared our culinary successes.

PERSONAL GROWTH: Use this time to take a little more time for yourself. Take walks outside in the beautiful spring weather. Try new recipes, take a nap, plant an herb garden... you get the idea!

PROFESSIONAL AFFAIRS: If you have retired, reach out to members and teachers you know who are still working from home. Send encouraging notes and positive emails. The switch to virtual teaching has been very time-consuming and laborintensive for many of our classroom educators. They are exhausted and frustrated, but still doing their best. Remember to reach out to them with your support

RESEARCH: Use this time to learn something new, or revisit a skill or hobby you have let go previously. Discover a new author— I recommend one of my fellow Gamma members, Amy Reece, whose *Seeker* series of young adult novels is fun to read!— watch silly YouTube videos, or plan an imaginary trip you want to take as soon as travel is OK again.

MUSIC: Dust off those old CDs or records and let yourself listen to music. Let the music move youdance, roll your shoulders, tap your feet, or simply close your eyes and listen deeply.

US FORUM/ LEGISLATIVE ISSUES:

This is NOT the time to quit paying attention to the news and important issues. Read the newspaper, watch the news, keep up with DKF's US Forum publications, and stay in touch with your legislative representatives. Many important political decisions—including elections— are happening in the next few weeks and months, and it's important to stay updated and vocal.

AWARDS: Once a week take a moment to think of someone who has done good things for you and send an email or text— or write a short personal note—thanking them for their important, positive influence on you. If that person has left this world, take a few minutes to meditate on that person's goodness and send a prayer or positive thought into the universe to honor that individual.

WORLD FELLOWSHIP/ EMERGENCY FUNDS:

So many people are in need right now. That might include you or some of your chapter members. Remember that it is much easier to give than receive. Don't forget to give as you can with service, funds, and time. But also be willing to receive. If you are a chapter member who is basically homebound during this pandemic and you need something, don't be afraid to reach out to a DKG sister and ask- for a quick errand, for a few groceries, for a few minutes of conversation, for a smile. So important, and certainly one of our strengths in DKG!
