During the next year, the president is asking that the bylaws committee consider the committee structure of Theta State. Three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350) was released for the **B. June West** Recruitment Grant to be awarded in the spring. The TS Executive Board voted to release the total amount available for the Theta State Scholarship. No one applied last year, so please encourage our members to apply this year (information on page 3). The Public Relations Committee is going to come up with a new “give-away” item for members that travel to Hawaii. Finally, Omega Chapter (Las Cruces) volunteered to host the 2018 Theta State Convention. The Executive Board approved this change to the convention rotation.

Our next Executive Board Meeting will be Friday, **April 28th** at the Theta State Convention in Albuquerque. You can find the registration on page 7 of this issue. Please note that the early bird registration is **January 1, 2017**.



Tips for Chapter Presidents

Meeting deadlines is an important aspect of being an effective president. Did you know that the deadline for scholarship applications and awards will be here before we know it? Not only can members apply for international scholarships, but Theta State offers a scholarship, and that scholarship deadline is fast approaching (see page 4). The official Delta Kappa Gamma website has a great calendar feature for chapter presidents. The calendar reminds us of upcoming deadlines as well as providing tips for effective chapter work. You can find the calendar at dkg.org under the *Resources* tab.

This year, Theta State will install a new slate of state officers. Chapter presidents know their members better than the state nominations committee. Serving as a Theta State officer is an honor. A woman selected to serve is provided with training, support, and leadership opportunities. Look around your chapter (or even at yourself) and find a member to nominate for a Theta State office. This year, we will be nominating and electing a **state president, first-vice president, second-vice president, corresponding secretary, and recording secretary**. The state **finance committee** will need nominees from the Northeast, Central, and Southwest to serve a four-year term. The state **nominations committee** will need nominees from the Southwest and Southeast to serve a four-year term. The nominees selected by the current nominations committee will be published in Theta State News prior to the state convention.

The Theta State Achievement Award is the **highest** award given to a member of Theta State. The nominee comes from the membership of Theta State. If you know a woman who has provided outstanding service to Theta State, you can nominate her for this honor. The nomination forms can be found on Theta State's website (thetastatenmdkg.weebly.com).

Communication is key to a successful chapter. Members want to know what is going on! Theta State News is one way to promote your chapter's activities and honor members. The deadlines are listed on the last page of the publication. You (or your communications chair) can send information about

members' achievements (Red Roses), a member's passing (White Roses), or chapter updates. Theta State News is your newsletter.

Are your members going to the state convention **April 28 - 30, 2017** in Albuquerque? The registration is in this issue of Theta State News. As a chapter president, you are a member of the Executive Board. The Executive Board approves the budget for Theta State, determines the location of state conventions, and a host of other business (as you can read in Theta State's bylaws and standing rules). At the spring convention, all members have a voice in the business of the general session. The members can hear first hand how their dues are spent, vote on the slate of officers and hear the reports of the committee chairs. As you probably know, the state convention is a great place for your members to get ideas for programs as they attend exciting and informative workshops.

Have you invited Theta State's **President** to a meeting? **Susan Swope** is an inspirational speaker, and she is excited to meet all the members of Theta State. When the state president comes to a chapter meeting, you will find that the members are excited to be a part of this exciting event. Our state president sits on the Executive Board of The Delta Kappa Gamma International Society for Key Women Educators. Epsilon Chapter (Silver City) Experience Dyslexia Conference

Members of Epsilon Chapter, Delta Kappa Gamma, attended the dyslexia conference in Silver City. On Wednesday, October 19th, **The Learning Center for Dyslexia and Academic Success (TLC for Dyslexia)** presented a workshop for participants to experience the struggles of **students with dyslexia**. **Tamara Ogilvie**, educational diagnostician with an emphasis in dyslexia, opened the workshop by telling the participants that dyslexia **affects about 15- 20% of the population**, yet it looks different in each individual. The goal of **TLC for Dyslexia** is early intervention to provide help for the child as early as possible. Dyslexia is a language-based disability particularly in reading, spelling, and written expression. The dyslexic brain is physiologically different, not inferior. To emphasize the importance of intervention, **Ms. Ogilvie** gave several significant statistics.

- Fifteen to 20% of the population, as a whole, display some symptoms of dyslexia.
- Sixty percent of American prison inmates are illiterate.
- Fourteen percent of school populations, nationwide, have an exceptionality that qualifies for special education.

The group participated in a simulation that was developed in California in the 1980s. Participants voiced some of their over-whelming emotions which included anxiety, frustration, and a sense of failure—**just as students with dyslexia must feel daily**.

The members of **TLC for Dyslexia and Academic Success** are dedicated to promoting awareness, early intervention, and providing the necessary therapy to qualifying students.
