

CLAIRE MILLER

1921-2014

"School and teaching have been my life," Claire said



in an interview in 2011. In college, she tutored other students in science and math. After completing her student teaching, she was hired to teach in a Los Angeles school district where she taught for two years. Then she went to Brazil to teach in an American school there. Returning to Los Angeles, she continued her

career as a teacher and principal in several elementary schools.

When she retired, she moved to Albuquerque where she started a successful tutoring program which she supervised for eleven years. At the age of 90, she was still acting as a resource person for other tutoring programs. Claire ended the interview by stating, "Good teaching is what I love. That's why I love my dance instructors." Claire was also an accomplished ballroom dancer and had received many trophies at national competitions.

Claire became an active member of Delta Kappa Gamma in 1962. She transferred to Alpha Iota Chapter in 2000 and remained active. She served in several positions on numerous committees, and as president of Alpha Iota 2010-12, hosted countless chapter meetings in her home, and was still playing in Alpha Iota's Marathon Bridge Club.

Claire died of natural causes while on a trip to California on October 25. Her funeral service will be held in California, and she will be buried next to her husband. Her daughter is planning an Open House at Claire's home in Albuquerque on December 6 at 4:00 or 5:00 p.m. We have lost an irreplaceable member of Delta Kappa Gamma and Alpha Iota.
