Theta State of Delta Kappa Gamma is pleased to announce that our Fall




Birthday Luncheon speaker is retired New Mexico Senator, Dede Feldman, who will be bringing us memories and excerpts from experiences she had

Dede tells about "maverick leaders, shameless special interests and earnest advocates clashing in our unique setting. She brings these stories alive, stories of grit and grace, honor and disgrace." This presentation about advocates, participants and citizens of New Mexico

promises to be thoroughly enjoyable. Her book will be sold at our luncheon.

Dede Feldman has had a varied career as a journalist, high school and university teacher, and the owner of a small public relations business. As a State Senator from District 13 in Albuquerque's North Valley since 1979, she has had a big impact on the lives of women, children, and struggling people and sponsored several successful initiatives. She also sponsored the "Do Not Call" bill prohibiting unwanted telephone solicitations. During her career, she has received numerous awards. She currently serves on the boards of the

New Mexico Foundation for Open Government, Health Insight New Mexico, and the Robert Wood Johnson's Aligning Forces for Quality.

Remember there are grants available for non-member women educators as well.


Who knows, you might be *encouraging* someone to become a key woman educator.

Santa Fe High School Names New Principal

Mary Massey is the new principal of Santa Fe High School,



the city's largest. The former journalist taught English at Santa Fe High some years ago and most recently served as one of its assistant principals. She is the fourth

person to take the job in the past five years.

The announcement of her appointment came less than two months after the district named Patrick Lenihan as principal of the school. But last week, Lenihan told Superintendent Joel Boyd that he is relocating to Washington state for both personal and professional reasons.

Lenihan had served as interim principal since January, when the district reassigned former Santa Fe High principal Leslie Kilmer to the position of athletic director for Santa Fe Public Schools. Kilmer had been principal of Santa Fe High School for about a year and a half, succeeding Robbie Stevens, who had been principal for two years.

Massey and her husband, Associated Press reporter Barry Massey, previously worked as journalists in Washington, D.C., before coming to Santa Fe.

After her first year of teaching, she became journalism adviser for Capital High School before becoming that school's instructional

US Forum Connection

Jones Loflin, US Forum Speaker, led participants through a process of the five C's, Creating a vision of success, Constructing a shared sense of urgency, Communicating to the right people, Crafting small concrete steps to success, and Celebrating small victories. He stressed that a shared sense of urgency can only be created by focusing on what others might gain, what they might lose, or what they have as a personal connection to the issue.

Using this process, the regions identified the following key legislative

issues:

- 1) Non-educators, especially corporations, controlling education;
- 2) The detriment of tying student test scores to teacher evaluation/performance pay;
- 3) Human trafficking and its implication to children's lives and education; and
- 4) Progress of our students and school safety issues for students and educators.

The regional representatives and members will continue to focus on these issues throughout the biennium.

Update on International Convention

From the President's Speech

Dr. Lyn Babb Schmid is the DKG International President for the 2014-2016 biennium. In her speech at the President's Banquet, she stated, "Vitally important in schools today is learning how to leverage distributed leadership to more effectively execute goals within members' sphere of school influence, to lead teams of educators to improve school environments, promoting learning of students and aspirations of teachers." Her goals for the biennium are:

1) Set High Quality Targets

- Identify women who have potential to make a difference in their work and in their community and invite them to join a professional Society of key women educators;
- Create a shared vision within the Society that has an appropriate level of ambition; and
- Select initiatives to realize our program and membership goals, and test new strategies.
- 2) Enlist Diverse Opinions
- Listen to people who have innovative ideas;
- Assess organizational capability and culture; and
- Encourage members to lead from any chair in the organization.
- 3) Take Multiple Shots on Goal
- Brainstorm winning ideas and transform them into solutions;
- Jumpstart growth and innovation project teams; and
- Gain organizational buy-in for new ideas.
- 4) Learn from experience and experiments
- Assess what has worked and what hasn't;
- Develop simple steps to evolve to the next generation of the Society; and
- Implement winning solutions throughout the Society.

Dr. Schmid informed us that we cannot fear change; in fact, **Dr. Blanton** encouraged change. As an 85 year old society, we must "progress forward." After all, Delta Kappa Gamma is a "spirit I take with me for the rest of my life."



Business Accomplished

At the beginning of each business session, our own Ina Jean Barnes presented the Credentials Committee report and moved its approval. At most, the voting strength of the assembly was 1,374. Dr. Helen Popovich (MI), Constitution Committee Chair, presented the proposed amendments to the International Constitution and International Standing Rules. The following amendments were **adopted** (list not inclusive):

- A new state organization shall have no fewer than forty (40) members.
- The International President will fill vacancies by appointment.
- Regional conferences will not receive funds to offset the cost of the state "night."
- States hosting an International Convention or Regional Conference may offer a reduced registration fee to members of the hosting team.
- The Society will produce a collegial magazine (unanimous affirmative vote)
- The DKG Bulletin will be published three (3) times a year, online.
- Honorary membership fee will be Forty-nine dollars and fifty cents (\$49.50).

The following amendments **failed** (list not inclusive):

- Adding "and in its sustainable development" to Purpose #7
- All amendments proposed to allow for General Election or Delegate Election options
- Holding Regional Conferences once every two years

The following was **postponed indefinitely**:

• Each member shall pay a World Fellowship Fee, annually.

Update on International Convention

The hotel was convenient and close to shopping, dining, and entertainment options which were all connected by the skybridge. **The Barnes' family** and **Amanda Matray** had fun with a progressive dinner at Harry and Izzy's with world famous shrimp cocktail and filet mignon, and then they got a bird's eye view of the city at the revolving rooftop, Eagle's Nest, while enjoying a decadent dessert.

DKG Conventions are a time for members to network, renew and grow friendships, and hear outstanding speakers. **Sarah Sladek** talked about *The End of Membership as We Know It.* **Ron Rosenburg** revealed "Hidden Secrets - Double Your Memory." **Dr. Ellen Kennedy** spoke to us about the world's fastest-growing criminal activity- human trafficking.

This convention was a constitutional convention where both governing documents (The DKG International Constitution and Standing Rules) were subject to change. Two big issues were: (1) Deciding on

allowing an option for a general election and (2) allowing more flexibility in the organization of Regional Conferences. Both proposals failed.

Dr. Jensi P. Souders was honored by receiving the 82nd International Achievement Award. **Dr. Lyn Schmid** from Pennsylvania was elected to serve as International President. Her new theme is **85 Years and Beyond Advancing Key Women Educators for Life**. She has put forth this challenge to you-"I hope you will join me this biennium in evolving the Society where it ought to be in order to sustain the magic of DKG".

Ina Jean Barnes served as Convention Credentials Chair from New Mexico. Ina Jean was also nominated by the International Nominations Committee to serve on the 2014-2018 International Nominations Committee. She was elected on Thursday by the delegates and installed at the Presidents' Banquet.

The Southwest Regional will be in Wichita, Kansas, July 22-25, 2015, and the next International Convention will be in Nashville, Tennessee, at the Gaylord Opryland Resort Convention Center July 5-10, 2016.
