#### Governor Martinez Reads to Mesa View

Mesa View Where Reading is First is where Ina Jean Barnes teaches reading intervention. For the second time in two years Governor Susana Martinez met with first graders to read and share the gift of reading. She read and discussed the book *E is for Enchantment* by **Helen Foster James** and illustrated by **Neecy Twinem**. The literacy project is part of the Governor's Reads to Lead program. Mesa View is a school in the Grants/ Cibola County school district. The school received a "B" grade last year and

this year from the state's Public Education Department. The school demographics are: 426 enrolled, 23% Special needs, 14% Anglo, 49% Hispanic,35% Native American, 2% other and 88% Economically Disadvantaged.

A panel discussion of **Nicholas Carr's** *The Shallows: What the Internet* 

is Doing to our Brains, introduced the afternoon program. The schedule included the following topics and speakers:

> Digital Storytelling by Dr. Gwen Countryman; Teaching Research Skills to Elementary Students Using Web Quest by Dr. Trini Tolar; Scientific Learning: Using Developmental e-Portfolios to Enhance Learning-Writing Across the Curriculum by Dr. C.A. Carey; International Service Learning; Study Abroad—points of convergence across borders by Dr. Maria Eugenia Trillo; and Technology in the Classroom by Dr. Colleen Walker.

Distinguished presenters were **Dr. Jacqui Cyrus** of the University of Guam who presented a wealth of information about Tools for Communication and Information – a presentation about FREE software and online tools for educators and student learners enabling them to gather resources that encourage connecting and communicating with educational technology. **Dr. Louisa Great**-

house, University of Puebla, Costa Rica, presented alternative educational environments that foster intercultural understanding through diverse learning communities.



#### Election process to be considered at 2014 International Convention

Members voting at the 2014 International Convention will consider proposed amendments that determine whether to continue with our current process of delegate voting or to institute a general election that allows every member to vote in the election of Administrative Board and elected committee members.

All members in attendance at the convention vote on proposed amendments to the *Constitution* and the *International Standing Rules*. Officers and elected committee members are currently elected by state organization presidents.

If the convention votes to allow every member to vote, all members will be able to vote for the members of the Administrative Board. Members would vote electronically or by requested paper ballot.

Various vending companies have submitted estimated costs of an electronic election ranging between \$15,000 and \$25,000 per election. The 2012-2014 Finance Committee is aware of the possibility of an every member voting election process. If the change is approved, the 2014-2016 Finance Committee will have the task of budgeting for the new voting process.


