

#### Goal Setting with Toni Hull



To find a really pertinent, insightful and entertaining presentation, DKG members went to listen to **Toni Hull** at the Theta State Convention

in Deming. This vibrant and intelligent young woman condensed goal setting into a format that was easy to "GRASP" (G=gratitude, R=relationships, A=attitude, S=scholarship, P=purpose and passion), as she explained how this method has motivated her to become the leader she is today. Successful goal setting requires one to deliberately identify not just the goal, but also the goodness in one's life to enable each person to make it through the tough times when the goal seems unreachable. It also helps to acknowledge the relationships that support you in reaching your goal. (Ever try to diet when your husband isn't dieting?) Setting a positive attitude and learning the foundational premises of your goal are excellent ways to set yourself up for success. Finally, the goal has to be your passion, and by identifying your purpose, you are more likely to achieve victory. Toni has used this method to complete higher education, lose weight and begin writing her first book. With organizational and leadership skills like this, no wonder she is a member of DKG!

# Setting the Tone with Dr. Hanna Fowler



Our visiting International Representative, **Dr. Fowler**, presented an introspective workshop on how the actions of each individual DKG member affects the tone of the chapter. Basing her talk on the book, *The Ripple Effect* 

by Steve Harper, she led members in examining how our individual actions, body language and enthusiasm impact the other members of our Chapter, and ultimately DKG as a whole. Members were divided into small groups and asked to jot down ideas on how each individual (not the chapter) can take on tasks that will have a positive impact on the group. Different groups shared such ideas as mixing it up at a meeting rather than just hanging out with one person, or calling members spontaneously to let them know you missed their presence. Granted, each chapter has a member or committee assigned to this, but when several people call, we tend to feel more wanted. Some groups schedule outside activities such as a scarf or purse exchange or a cook out at someone's home. Finally, Dr. Fowler suggested we get off our "but" ("but I can't do that," etc.) in order to inspire our chapter members and potential members into becoming enthusiastic, invigorated members. Alpha Delta Chapter did the Ceremony of Remembrance for Dr. Mary Small at this time.

Dr. Small taught for 46 years (1954-2000). She taught in Tyler and Austin, Texas; Denver, Colorado; Nashville, Tennessee; and Washington D.C. She was an English Professor, and Department Head of English and other Languages. She lectured in many Universities throughout the USA and Europe. Dr. Small wrote many publications, scientific papers, and books that were published. She had received many Honors, Awards and Special Recognitions. She was featured as the "Woman of Distinction" in the Theta State News, May issue, Delta Kappa Gamma Society International in May 2003. Recently, she was writing another book. Dr. Small had been ill, but she always had a positive outlook on life. Her outstanding trait was her infectious smile, and her constant concern about everyone she knew.

Dr. Small was married to Robert J. Small for 68 years, and had three sons, Thomas, Darien and Evan Small and four grandchildren. She will be missed by her Alpha Delta sisters.

Helen Jo Satterwhite passed away May 10, 2014 at her home in Albuquerque. Helen Jo Satterwhite, an Oklahoma native, attended school her first 12 years in Bishop, OK. She earned her BS degree from Northwestern University at Alva, OK, and her master's degree from

the University of Oklahoma. Helen Jo taught in several states prior to coming to Albuquerque where she taught at Matheson Park Elementary and retired in 1990. In 1974, Ms. Satterwhite was initiated into Alpha Delta Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International. She served her chapter as Chapter President and as chairman of numerous committees. In 1981, she was Chairman of Publicity for the SW Regional Conference in Albuquerque, and in 2001, she served as SW Regional Conference Editor. Helen Jo served as Theta State President in the 1983-1985 biennium during which time she provided leadership meetings for incoming chapter presidents (1984) and incoming state officers and committee chairmen (1985). She served as chairman of the International Communications Committee (1982-1984). In 1983, Helen Jo was selected to attend the Golden Gift Leadership Training held at Baylor University in Waco, Texas. She was awarded the Theta State Achievement Award in 1987. Other services to Theta State include Bylaws Chairman (1995-1997), TS Leadership Chairman (1999-2001), and she served as Theta State News Editor from 1995-2003. She has been a member of the Theta State Executive Board from 1981 to the present.

Helen Jo was devoted to the purposes of Delta Kappa Gamma, ever the willing volunteer, and committed to the advancement of women of all walks of life. She has been a valued member of Theta State and will be missed.

#### **Communications Survey**

State Communications & Publicity Committee Chairs summarized what their chapters are doing to inform their members and their communities about DKG.

Communication is essential for making connections and fulfilling the 7 purposes of DKG. Fifty-six percent (rounded up) maintain a website, but only 13% have an assigned web watcher. Twenty-six percent submitted press releases to local media, while only 14% shared "elevator" speeches. It is shocking to note that 4,759 members (6%) do not use electronic media.

Forty-one percent of chapters have newsletters, and 31% of those are mailed. These statistics are available at www.dkg.org under the *Committee* tab. We have to ask

ourselves:

- \* Are we helping our members into the 21st century?
- \* Are we promoting DKG as a society to which we are proud to belong?
- \* Are we meeting the needs of early career educators that are technologically savvy?
- \* Do we utilize all the resources available to chapters for growth?

According to the survey, only 17% of the responding chapters have a chapter brochure or DKG fact sheet. Thirty percent of chapters still have a phone tree and 13% receive chapter newsletter from a member who goes for a visit.
